

REVOLUTION CYCLING TEAM – CONSTITUTION

1. NAME

The name of the organisation shall be 'Revolution Cycling Team', hereinafter referred to as the 'Club'.

2. OBJECTIVES

The club is established to pursue the following objectives:

- Participation in the sport of cycling, hereinafter referred to as the 'Sport'.
- The development of cycling skills for all members of the club
- Membership of appropriate affiliations and organisations for the purpose of establishing regular competition for the Club
- The provision of training, coaching and guidance for its members
- Promoting and maintaining the highest standards of technical competence and safety in the sport
- Upholding the rules of the sport
- Providing equal opportunities for successful participation by all sections of the community.
- The promotion of the sport
- The promotion of a healthy lifestyle

3. AFFILIATION

The club shall be affiliated to Scottish Cycling and British Cycling.

4. MEMBERSHIP

All members are subject to the constitution of the club and the regulations of the National Governing Body.

- Membership of the club is open to all individuals provided they comply with this Constitution.
- No person shall be refused membership on the grounds of race, colour, creed, religion, sex, sexual preference, impairment or disability.
- All applications for membership shall be accompanied by the appropriate annual membership fee, which shall thereafter be payable on demand.
- Each fully paid up member shall be entitled to attend and vote at General or Annual General Meetings.
- Fully paid up members who are affiliated with Scottish Cycling may be elected and serve on the Management Committee.
- All members will receive guidance on where they can obtain a copy of the relevant Code of Conduct, a copy of the Club's Child Protection Policy and a copy of the Constitution.
- Members shall be enrolled on one of the following categories:
 - Playing/Competing member
 - Coach / Ride Leader(qualified)
 - Volunteer / Helper
 - Junior Member
 - Life Member

5. SUSPENSION, REFUSAL OR TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP

The management committee shall be entitled to:

- Refuse any application for membership on the grounds that such membership would be prejudicial to the objectives set out in section 2 of this constitution.
- For good and sufficient reason, refuse renewal of any existing membership or suspend or terminate any membership provided that the member concerned shall have the right to be heard by the full management committee before a final decision is made.

The member may apply for reinstatement at the next general meeting.

Any member who fails to pay their fees by the date required shall forfeit their right to representation on the management committee and at general meetings, and shall be suspended from taking part in any event under the control of the club until such fees are paid.

Any member under suspension shall be barred from taking part in any event under the control of the club and also from representing the club in any other event.

The membership committee shall inform the member in writing of any decision to terminate their membership. Notification of the termination of a membership will be forwarded to the governing body.

6. GENERAL MEETINGS

Annual General Meeting

The AGM shall be held each year at such time and place as determined by the management committee, at approximately twelve monthly intervals, but no more than fourteen months after the date of the previous AGM. At each AGM the following business shall be conducted:

- Receive and confirm the minutes of the previous AGM
- Presentation of the clubs financial accounts for the year
- Presentation of the clubs projected financial situation for the forthcoming year and setting of all fees
- Presentation of the Chairpersons report
- Election of officers to the management committee
- Any other business brought before the meeting which has been submitted in writing to the secretary not less than seven days prior to the AGM, and any other business deemed relevant by the chairperson

Notice for an AGM will be at minimum 21 days. A quorum for an AGM will be 8 members.

Extraordinary General Meetings

An EGM may be called upon the written demand of:

- 33% of the membership
- The Chairperson
- 66% majority of the management committee

Notice for an EGM will be a minimum of 14 days, and stating the business to be discussed.

7. RULES FOR GENERAL MEETINGS

A minimum of twenty one days' notice in writing shall be given to all members, except in the event of an EGM where the notice shall be to a minimum of fourteen days.

The chairperson, or in his/her absence a member selected by the meeting, will take the Chair.

All members shall register with the Secretary prior to the start of the meeting.

Each member shall have one vote.

All votes shall be determined by a simple majority. In the event of a tied vote, the Chair may exercise a casting vote.

The secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings and record all proceedings and resolutions.

8. ELECTION OF OFFICERS TO THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The members of the management committee shall be drawn from the membership, as defined in section 4 of this constitution.

Candidates shall be elected by paper ballot at the AGM, and shall be members of the management committee from the conclusion of that AGM until the conclusion of the following AGM.

All nominations of candidates for election shall: have the consent of the nominee, be in writing, be seconded and be received by the secretary not less than 14 days before the AGM.

Uncontested posts may be filled by nominations and election at the AGM.

The secretary shall send all members a list of all nominations not less than seven days prior to the AGM.

9. MEMBERS OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The management committee shall consist of the following members:

- President
- Vice President
- Chairperson
- Event/Competition Secretary
- Club Secretary
- Treasurer
- Head Coach / Ride Leader
- Child and Vulnerable Adult Officer (Male and Female preferably)

All the above shall be entitled to one vote at each General Meeting, with the exception of the Chair.

The committee may co-opt any member to any unfilled post until the conclusion of the following AGM, provided the delegates shall not exceed one third of the total number of persons serving on the committee at that time.

The management committee may appoint any sub-committees it may deem necessary to deal with specific club matters. The proceedings of all such committees shall report to the management committee by a representative elected by that sub-committee.

10. RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Chairperson shall chair the meeting. In his/her absence the President, Vice President or Secretary may Chair. If all the aforementioned are absent, a nominee from the committee may Chair.

Fourteen days' notice of any meeting of the management committee shall be given by the secretary, except when:

- The date of the meeting had been agreed at the previous management meeting, in which case seven days' notice shall be given
- In an emergency the chair person may call a meeting with four days' notice.

The quorum shall be four of those officers entitled to vote, as listed in section 9.

All members of the management committee as listed in section 8 shall be entitled to vote.

All votes shall be determined by a simple majority. In the event of a tied vote, the Chair may exercise a casting vote.

Meetings shall be open to all members of the club

11. FINANCE

The income and property of the club, however derived, shall be applied solely towards the objectives of the club as set out in section 2 of this constitution.

The club shall have the power to raise money by means of yearly affiliation fees and event fees as determined by the Management Committee at the Annual General Meeting.

All monies shall be lodged in a bank account in the name of the club.

The President, Vice President, Treasurer and the Secretary shall be authorised to sign cheques on behalf of the club, of which two signatories shall be needed.

The financial year of the club shall run from 6th April one year to 5th April the following year.

12. AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION

This Constitution may only be amended by a proposal passed by a majority of members present and entitled to vote at an Annual or Extraordinary General Meeting.

13. THE DISSOLUTION OF THE CLUB

Any resolution to dissolve the club may be passed at any General Meeting provided that:

- The terms of the proposed resolution are received by the Secretary at least 42 days before the meeting at which the resolution is to be brought forward, and that
- At least twenty eight days of the proposed resolution shall be given in writing by the Secretary to all members and that
- Such a resolution shall receive the assent of 80% of those present and entitled to vote.

Upon dissolution of the club, after all club and trustee liabilities have been cleared, all remaining financial and material assets shall be given or transferred to Scottish Cycling or to the Nairn Sports Council, as determined by the meeting, to be employed for the development of the sport.
